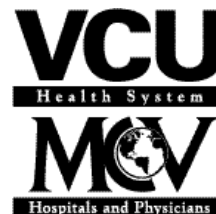

March Of Dimes Honors MCVH NICU Nurses

You've heard of it...the March of Dimes WalkAmerica. But did you know it's a walk-a-thon that saves the lives of babies born prematurely or with birth defects?

For the past 62 years, the March of Dimes has saved millions of babies from death or disability. For the first time in its history, the March of Dimes will dedicate this year's WalkAmerica to a healthcare group: Newborn Intensive and Intermediate Care Unit (NICU) nurses.

MCV Hospital's NICU is forming its own heroic group to walk. Staff and former NICU graduates will join Sharon Cone, Team Captain and Nurse Manager of the Newborn Intensive and Intermediate Care Unit.

The NICU at MCV Hospitals, a 40-bed unit, is the largest pediatric intensive care facility in Central Virginia, providing a full range of services for both extremely premature infants as well as some of the most challenged newborns. As a top rated unit, it was the first in the state and one of the first in the country to provide ECMO (Extra-Corporeal Membrane Oxygenation), a lifesaving therapy that can take over the function of heart and lungs for a time of healing.

WalkAmerica will be held at Byrd Park on Saturday, April 21 from 8 a.m. to 10 a.m. Registration is at 8 a.m. at the Carillon in Byrd Park and the walk begins at 9 a.m. If you'd like to participate, call 828-1469. You too can be a hero.
